# Before and After School organisation

I thought it was timely to remind everyone what happens before and after school

Before School - Duty teacher starts at 8.30am

- When children arrive at school they put their bags away and prepare themselves for the day and then head outside - If it is wet then that is managed at the time by the teachers in class.
- If they arrive before 8.30am they are restricted to the Tennis Court and corner playground Once the duty teacher starts they can go out to the other playgrounds.
- There will always be a teacher here for the early bus which arrives around 8.05am.
- All other buses arrive after 8.30am


After School - Duty teacher finishes at 3.15pm once the last bus leaves, which is the run up Tourere Rd.

If children are being picked up they wait up on the Hall verandah until the buses have gone and then they go to the corner playground and wait to be picked up there - whether by family/whanau or the Tourere bus.

# **RESPECT – INTEGRITY – SUCCESS – EMPATHY**

Just a reminder about the work we started at the beginning of 2023 and ended with the new school values which was a fantastic journey - This has all been part of developing School Wide PB4L - Positive Behaviour for Learning. From a staff perspective we will continue on with developing the Matrices/Tables of our Values and what the Expectations are in various settings - Not that we didn't know already but this is the process of making it very clear and accessible for everyone.

We started with RESPECT and have started the review of what we have done and looking at unpacking our other Values

The settings at this stage are:

In General, In the Classroom, In The Grounds, In Assembly, When Transitioning from one activity to another, On the Bus, When at school events. These could change as we go along but it gives a general understanding of how the Values link into PB4L and what our Expectations are in a particular setting.

This will lead into the development of lessons that each teacher can use to give the children clear and consistent understanding of how to conduct themselves.

# GOTCHAs are an integral part of the PB4L process

- GOTCHAs are given to children for displaying the things that we VALUE at Flemington aligning with RISE
- We have introduced another aspect of this with the playground RISE GOTCHA which are given to children during break times. These are a shorter term award system at this stage.
- The Playground RISE awards go into a container in the office and are drawn out randomly, with an ice block for those drawn out.
- The main GOTCHAs will be awarded mainly in class at this stage and at assembly each week one from each class are drawn out to select something from the Prize Box.
- All GOTCHAs given out that week get counted and added to each child's cumulative total with further awards given for reaching 25, 50, 75 or 100 GOTCHAs during the year - So if they do not get drawn out at weekly assembly their GOTCHAs will still count!

# **TECHNOLOGY CENTRE REQUEST**

The Technology Centre is after empty plastic bottles with lids. Ideal bottles include 600ml fizzy drink bottles and 500ml cream bottles. Smaller bottles such as 300ml are great too. Ideally the bottle has a tapered design.

Please can you bring clean bottles to school and they will be delivered to the Tech Centre with the Year 7 and 8 students on their next visit.

Why do they want plastic bottles? For their first project this year which is making Fly Fans. To reduce plastic waste going to landfill the Tech Centre would like to reuse rather than buying new ones. The bottles will house the electrical circuits and support the motor that will drive the fan.
