Kia ora koutou katoa

Another week goes by and not a lot of rain so let's hope there is a bit coming along the pipeline. We had a great session with Robyn McCann last night around Positive Behaviour for Learning (PB4L) and how it links to the Science of Learning and the 3 days of PLD we did with Liz Kane around structured literacy a couple of weeks ago.

Robyn really helped us to see the links between all of the strategies and actions we use, and do, on a daily basis as teachers to support the children's learning and linking that to the purpose of PB4L. Then working through how the Science of Learning underpins it all in regard to how we all learn new knowledge and then how we transfer that new learning into the children's long-term memory so it sticks. Building the knowledge and skills that are in a child's long-term memory is the ultimate goal of teaching. One of those key aspects is the physical layout of the learning environment - the classroom. Some of the children may have come home over the last week or so talking about some changes in the classroom:

- All facing the area where the teaching is being done the front of the classroom
- Arranging the desks or tables to support this desks are ideal for this but tables can be used as well but only sitting on one side of them so they are facing the teacher and teaching area.
- Minimising distraction in that teaching space clearing it of things that could distract and child some are much more easily distracted than others.

Just a bit more about short term memory, or working memory - It is where information is stored temporarily while we work with it such as doing calculations in your head, like figuring out the cost of groceries - this relies on working memory to hold the prices while you do the calculations – if you don't know the timetables then some of your working memory is used to remember how to work it out – now it has to hold the numbers and the calculation process - it can get overloaded at this stage and some of the prices drop out of your memory. Working memory can only hold a few bits of information at a time - typically 5 to 9 bits and only hold them there for maybe 30sec, so it is quite limited. Through good instruction and repetitive learning, we can move and embed it in children's long-term memory, where it can be retrieved as needed. There is lots going on in the brain when learning is happening! Phil
