Kia ora koutou katoa

It is a pretty clear run this week and it is looking the same for the next couple of weeks leading up to the Term break. School will be closed on Friday 20th June in acknowledgement of Matariki and on the last Friday of term we are planning to have our biennial 'Open Fire Cook Out'. Which the kids are very excited about! We did the first one of these many years ago when we were studying the early years in New Zealand. There is a photo in the hall with everyone dressed up in colonial clothing and as a finishing off activity we ran an open fire cooking day. We didn't do that again for a few years until Matariki Day was established and we started putting down a hangi to bring Matariki alive for kids and then did the open fire cooking every second year. Matariki marks the appearance of the Pleiades star cluster in the early morning sky and is recognized as the Māori New Year.

The Māori proverb 'Matariki whetū heri kai' which is 'Matariki, the bringer of food' highlights that food link. Food is central to the celebration of Matariki, and Māori believe that the appearance of Matariki in the morning sky in winter would determine the success or failure of kai harvesting. Different stars in the cluster have an association to the various domains from where food is sourced as well, in particular: gardens (Tupuānuku), forests (Tupuārangi), fresh water (Waitī) and the ocean (Waitā). This underpins the traditional and strong relationships the Māori world has with the environment and everything within it, which also holds true for rural communities around the New Zealand and the World. 

OPEN FIRE COOKING - FRIDAY 27th JUNE

We have had a couple of open fire cooking sessions over the years with the last one in 2023. We are planning another one at the end of this term. Fire and cooking are a big part of Matariki, which we will weave into this activity.

The Yr 4-8 children will be organised into House groups of 5-6 with older to younger in each group. They will plan a menu for themselves and the materials and equipment they will need to cook it, along with the what wood they will need for their fires, so you may get a bit pestered over the next couple of weeks! - They will also cook sausages, which we will supply, for the Yr 1-3 children.

They will have their initial meeting today and then have a follow up meeting on Monday to report back about what they can or can't bring along for their group.
