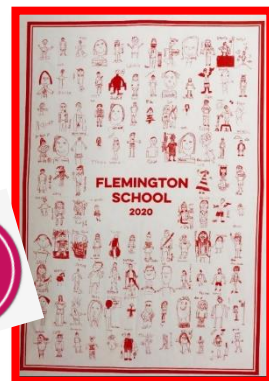
- 9.00am – Parents/Caregivers arrive and set up, ready for a 9.30 start
